

SJRGC IPSC / STEEL CHALLENGE 2025 COMMITTEE REPORT:

IPSC SJRGC had 5 matches booked for 2025 and the Atlantic's Tournament. The attendance this year was down compared to last year in due to two primary reasons:

1. Banning of PCC by the government. Taking a lot of people out of the ability to shoot.
2. Wild fires raged near the range for some time this past August and caused the board to suspend activities and IPSCNL decided to cancel the Atlantic's Tournament for the same reason (also large loss of potential revenue to the club).

- IPSC SJRGC did hold the provincial's tournament in late September and was attended
- by 12 members.
- Only 1 black badge course was offered early in the year.
- One well attended mini rifle match was held in October.
- Three club members attended the IPSC National's event in Tabor, Alberta.

IPSC uprights for targets were all renewed this year, equipment is in good shape for 2026 as some other repairs were also carried out over the year. Although talks for a shed or storage would be nice in the nearer future, when funds are improved.

STEEL CHALLENGE:

Steel challenge was held Tuesday evenings in spring, summer and part of fall and was reasonably well attended, but shut downs and banning of PCC again reduced numbers. Tony Mackey shoot held on October 5th and was well attended with 16 shooters. Equipment remains in good shape and maintained.
